

# EPIC POETRY











- CS Long narrative poems celebrating the adventures and achievements of a hero

#### ≪ Free Verse is...

- An irregular form of poetry in which the content is free of fixed meter or rhyme.
- The poet's main consideration is where to insert line breaks.
- Some ways of doing this include breaking the line where there is a natural pause or at a point of suspense for the reader.

- An unrhymed Japanese verse
- Consists of three unrhymed lines of five, seven, and five syllables (5, 7, 5) or 17 syllables in all.

#### 

- a rhymed humorous or nonsense poem of five lines (AABBA) which originated in Limerick, Ireland
- Are usually obscene and began in pubs/bars
- Ropularized by Edward Lear
  - Cleaned them up a bit

# Palindrome Poetry





**∞**A palindrome is...

a word, phrase, verse, sentence, or even poem that reads the same forward or backward.

Also known as Mirror poetry

# Sonnet Poetry

#### A Sonnet is...

- A poem consisting of 14 lines in iambic pentameter with a particular rhyming scheme
- A Shakespearean (English) sonnet has three quatrains and a couplet, and rhymes abab cdcd efef gg
- (3) *Iambic Pentameter* is when a line of poetry has 5 sets of stressed and unstressed syllables

#### Example:

O! then vouchsafe me but this loving thought:


'Had my friend's Muse grown with this growing
